


The Greek and Roman Gods and Goddesses By Kelsey G-B (Griswold-Bacigalupi)


Some of the Greek gods are larger than legend. Most of them have two names: one is Greek and the other is Roman. Their names and personalities are still with us today. For example, some of the planets in our solar system are named after them.

- Ares—Mars
- Cronus—Saturn
- Aphrodite—VenusHades—Pluto\*
- Hermes—MercuryUranus—Uranus
- Zeus—Jupiter
- Poseidon—Neptune


<sup>\*</sup> In 2006 the status of Pluto was downgraded to "dwarf planet."




The Greeks and Romans worshipped the same gods, just with different names. The Greek gods and goddesses are in black type and the Roman gods and goddesses are in white type.
